

## Marine Aircraft Group 16 Command Philosophy



Our Mission: Provide premier assault support to Marine, joint, and coalition forces from advanced bases, expeditionary airfields or aircraft capable ships in order to enable the CG to fight the MAW as a piece of the MEF level MAGTF in support of the Joint Force Commander. Be prepared to deploy the MAG headquarters and staff support during site command and MEB ACE operations necessary for the effective command and control of subordinate squadrons and attachments in order to ensure success across the full range of military operations.

Philosophy: Combat Readiness. This term means different things to different people. For us, we will answer this question:

Could we leave for the combat zone tomorrow should the Congress or the President of the United States deem it necessary to defend our way of life or fight for things that are in our nation's best interest?
